24 April 1541 King H[enry] VIII 32 [year of reign]

Henry the eight of England and France King Defender of the Faith Lord of Ireland supreme Head of the Church of England to all whom these present[ment]s shall come Health [Greeting crossed out] know that we for the sum of twenty eight pounds and ten shillings of lawful money of England paid into the hands of ye Treasurer of ye Court of Augmentations of our Crown to our ..., by our beloved **John Godard** of Alburne in our County of Wilts Gentleman, out of our special grant certain knowledge and good will we have given and granted and by these present[ment]s do give and grant to ye said **John Godard** all those Lands Tenem[ent]s Fields and pastures of ours with ye appurtenances lately granted to ye aforesaid **John Godard** and now in his occupation situate and lying and being in the Vill[age] and Fields of Wanborough and Upham in our said County of Wilts lately belonging to ye lately dissolved Monastery of Lacoke [Lacock] in our said County of Wilts and all those Lands Tenements Fields Meadows and pastures of ours with their appurtenances lately granted to ye said **John Godard** or being in his possession situate lying or being in Wegglestow in ye Parish of Wroughton in our said County of Wilts lately belonging to and appertaining to ye said Monastery, ye whole Rectory and our Church of Clyffe Pypard in our said County of Wilts with all their appurtenances in our said County of Wilts lately belonging and appertaining to the said Monastery and ye advowson of ye free Donation Dispoition (sic) and Right of Patronage of ye Vicarage of ye Church of Clyffe Pypard in our said County of Wilts and all Messuages Houses Buildings Orchards Stables Lands Fields Meadows Pastures Woods and underwoods Commons Glebes Tythes Payments Portions together with ye emoluments Commodities Whatsoever in Clyffe Pypard in our said County of Wilts and elsewhere wheresoever they are in any shape belonging and appertaining unto ye said Rectory and Church of Clyffe Pypard in ye same county and all and singular ye Premss. and also ye provisions Incomes and yearly Profits of all and singular ye premss. above expressed and specified as full and wholly and in as full Manner form as if ye abbess of ye lately af[oresai]d Monastery or any ye late preceding Abbesses of ye same late Monastery in ye Monastery above at any time before ye Dissolution of ye same late Monastery or before ye late Monastery came to our hands if aforesaid Messuages and all other and singular of prmss. had hold or enjoyed or ought to have had and enjoyed, and so full and wholly and in such [full & complete crossed through] large manner and form as those all and singular to our Hands by Reason or pretence of ye Dissolution of ye aforesaid Monastery of Lacoks [Lacock] or by Reason or Pretence of any Gift Grant or Confirmation by ye late abbess and late Convent of ye aforesaid Monastery under their Conventicles to us conferred or by which other means soever come or ought to come and in our Hands now are or ought to be. St Giles's Aug. 12. 1769

Sir,

On Tuesday last in the Evening  
I came to Salisbury and immediately waited  
upon thei Bishops. — I acquainted thei Lordship

with your design of entering into Orders. —  
When he was fully informed of your family,  
Education, Character and other circumstances,  
he did me the honor to say he should be  
Directed by me, and desir'd when you  
came to him you would please to  
mention my name — And you may  
Depend upon it, every thing will  
be made easy and agreeable to you.  
The Ordination will be at Salisbury  
in Ember week in Sept. next. Before  
which

which time his Lordship will expect a  
Testimonium signed by three Clergymen, as  
is usual on these occasions. The Form  
you may take from Bourno's Ecclesiasti-  
cal Laws; and if you send it under cover  
to me at the Earl of Shaftesbury's at  
St. Giles's near Cranbourne Dorset.  
I will set my name to it, and deliver  
it to the Bishop. — You know  
the Patron cannot present himself;  
and the Benefice being now vacant,  
the rights of Presentation cannot  
be transferred to another that  
he may present you — but

But the Bishop may in this case order  
Institution without Presentation, - or  
collate you when it lapses. -
