Dear Sherry Kay Cox,

Rob Wilson, your distant cousin has give me your name.

Twenty years ago I helped the Berrett family of Steeple Ashton, Wilts., (where we were living at the time) write their family tree. I learnt how the Mormon missionaries came to Wiltshire and made many converts from 1849 onwards. Many of the villagers from Steeple Ashton went to Utah and it was descendants of this and other families who were instrumental in getting the book written. I have been fascinated by this emigration ever since.

I am also research co-ordinator of the Goddard Association of Europe and recently we decided to write up the story of the Goddard families of the Pewsey Valley, including Burbage. imagine how delighted I was to discover that Goddards were among the converts to Mormonism in the 1850s and that they are mentioned in court cases of Marlborough Petty Sessions of the time.

I gather that your family, the Coxes, did not leave Burbage until 1874 - a time when the first descendants of the emigrants were coming back to Steeple Ashton on visits. Would you be interested in exchanging information? I am not on the Internet, but quite happy to exchange letters speedily by snail-mail.

I have confirmed that there is a part of Burbage named East Sands. Is there a place of the same name in Utah where they settled? I cannot find a large scale map of Utah in Newbury and the current Mormon missionaries to the town (one of whom comes from Pleasant, Utah, he tells me) have not been about lately for me to ask.

Dear Julie,

My (3rd) cousin Sue Walther passed on to me your letter of 25th may to Robert Bremer. I'm sure Robert did tell me about this a while ago and promised to mail it to me but it got to me from Sue first!

Anyway, by way of introduction, I set up the Burbage Web site and Robert kindly offered to host the database part of it. I look after the other sections, and I have added your contributions to the MIs and Bibliography - thank you so much.

Did you know Burbage has another Web site? Set up by Colin Younger (who lives there) it's aimed more at local history but there is a lot of family history information too. The URL is <http://www.kinwardstone.clara.net/> How many villages in the UK could have not just one Web site but two!!

You mentioned LDS emigration. Have you come across Sherry Cox? Her address is: Sherry Kay Cox, 1063 East Dover Drive, Provo, Utah 84604 , USA. Sherry is descended from Burbage COXs (as am I) . Her grandfather Walter Cox (or Stagg) converted to LDS in Burbage in 1874. I haven't heard from Sherry for a while but I'd be happy to contact her by email if you would like to pursue anything. Colin Younger would also surely have some information - he once mentioned the following in an email to Sherry and me:

Do you have any details about the spread of the Mormon faith in Burbage. I can find little about it other than some vague references.

Is there a place in Utah called Eastsands or East Sands. Locals have told me that some of the Mormon converts went to Utah and founded a settlement which they named after their part of Burbage.

Good luck with the Goddard Association - I started a one name society for JELBERT (Cornwall) five years ago but I can't get anyone to take over the secretary/editor job!
