Thank you for your letter about the Donhead St Mary Goddards. I have found your letter of last year in my files. My reply advised you to contact

David Goddard, 144 Banstead Road, Carshalton, Surrey SM5 4DW

who is also descended from the David Goddard in your family tree. I am afraid that he has given us no further details than this. Perhaps you would like to get together, combine your family trees and then tell me the result so that I can add them to our records.

I also suggested that, with regard to the "stray" ladies in your tree, that perhaps Mary Bratcher came from Stourton or Wilton, near Salisbury (where the name is not uncommon) and that Mary Harmon came from Wilton. Both names have alternative spellings - Harman and Brasher/Braysher.

Is Elizabeth Paul the one born at Chippenham in 1694, the daughter of Humphrey Paul? (Paul can also be spelt Powell). We do have a record of another Edward Goddard who was married to an Ann at this time, but her name was Anne Codrington.
