Dear Mrs Goddard,

Thank you for your letter and for all the information therein. I apologize for not writing earlier, but we were on holiday for a few weeks - trying to escape some of the bad weather that we often have at this time of year.

I was especially pleased to get the information of the marriage of William Goddard and Mary Brown (17 July 1815). I had not been able to find any record of Mary's maiden name. Their son, William (1790-1869) also had a son named William (1818-1875) who married Caroline Kimber at Easton on 7 July 1842. It was this couple who moved to London, where, in 1847, his occupation is listed as "groom". The address given on Elizabeth Goddard's birth certificate is Hoop and Grapes, Broadway. When William died in 1875, he died in Easton, and is buried there - according to parish records. At that time his occupation was given as farmer.

I have always presumed that Williams cab business in London was taken over by his son, George Goddard, who is found on the 1881 census. But to date I have had no success in tracing this business. Further to this, I notice that George Goddard (1849-1895) was married to Sarah Ann Spackman. Is it possible that these two are first cousins? I have this information from the birth reg. of their child.


My questions, at this time, are concerning the farming enterprise of William Goddard. How did he acquire the farm? When did he acquire it? Any info relating to this time period (1870-75).

Are William and Caroline Goddard shown on the 1871 census at Easton? Their youngest child, Rebecca would have been six years old at that time.

Caroline (Kimber) Goddard died Feb 1905 in Kintbury, BERKS. But I am not sure where she is buried.

I have not had any contact from those to whom you sent letters. I know I have gone on at some length here. I do appreciate any help you can give me and I thank you again for your patience. I look forward to hearing from you again.

Dear Mrs. Goddard,

Thank you so much for your prompt reply and for the information on the goddard Assoc. I enclose the amount of 8 pounds for membership.

I have searched the parish records for Easton Parish. I have found the burial of William Goddard (great-great grandfather) in 1875. This is confirmed by his death certificate from the GRO.

The following is the confirmed information that I have:

- William born 8 Dec 1854, died 11 May 1860
- Robert born 13 Feb 1857, died 5 Feb 1891
- Caroline born 2 Feb 1859
- Harry born 30 June 1862 died 10 Sept 1870
- Rebecca born 1 July 1866

The family was living in London, in 1847 Elizabeth's birth cert. indicates their address as "Hoop and Grapes" and her father's occupation as that of groom. It is my understanding that William eventually owned his own cab business, which was taken over by son George who was living as 34 Artillery Row on the 1881 census.

Is there any way that I can track down William's business between 1847 and 1875, the time of his death. He died at Easton, did not have a will, so his estate, (livestock, farm, etc) was sold and the proceeds divided. I have a copy of the statement of disbursements as well as the letters of admon.

Hello Julie, thank you for the email. Sorry I have been out of touch for so long, the last 4 years have been so eventful I have neglected a lot of my family tree work. I hope all is well with you and the family?
My line comes through Harriet Goddard born in Burbage in 1844. She was the illegitimate daughter of Jane Goddard who was the daughter of Stephen and Mary Goddard. Stephen was the son of Stephen Goddard and Jane Wilkins. I am sure there was a connection with Margaret's line.

Harriet Goddard moved to Wilmington, Dartford Kent sometime around 1861. She appears working in a beer house with a family called Stringer. Closer inspection revealed that Mrs Maria Stringer was her aunt and also came from Ram Alley, Burbage. This was Maria's second marriage, her first being to a man called Collard, her maiden name at the time of the first marriage was Goddard. I havent yet been able to place who Maria Goddard is. Presumably if she is Harriets aunt, she was a sister to Jane, Harriet's mother.
Another look at the census in Wilmington turned up another Easton Royal resident.

A little further up the lane from the Stringers in 1871 are a family called the Pricters (or Pricktore, Prictor), the wife Ann was from Easton Royal. A look at FreeBMD reveals that she and John Pricktore were married in Marlborough in 1843 and she also is a Goddard.
So that gives us a total of 3 Goddard women from Easton living within a few yards of each other. They must all be related but I havent got any certificates yet to establish who is who. Anyway maybe you have these among your strays?
