Dear Mrs Atherton,

Welcome to the association!

I think I can help you with your family tree from our records.

Jonathan Goddard, bachelor of "Eversley" (Everleigh, outside Pewsey) married **Sarah Ward**, spinster, at Pewsey on 11 July 1829.

They had the following children baptised at Pewsey

Mary 24 Jan 1830

James 29 April 1832

Charles 14 Sept 1834

William 20 Mar 1836

Eliza 25 Dec 1840

John May 13 1843

George Dec 25 1844

Children were not necessarily baptised the moment they were born, but at a convenient time after - or when the vicar called and started checking up on the family. Mary could have been 18 months or so old.

In each entry Jonathan is described as a labourer.

Mary's marriage entry reads

14 Nov 1846

George Kimber of full age labourer of Milbourne (ie Milton Lilbourne) son of Thomas Kimber

Mary Goddard of full age spinster, daughter of Jonathan Goddard, labourer of Pewsey
Now Mary was not of full age ie 21, but as she was over 16 and of marriageable age, and there was no impediment to the marriage, I do not suppose it mattered.

Jonathan Goddard was buried in Pewsey cemetery Mar 6 1870 aged 79

Sarah Goddard, nee Ward was buried in Pewsey Jun 14 1888 aged 84

Mary's sister **Eliza** married Edward Flippance (or Fribbance) 25 Dec 1862 and her brother **George** married Mary Ann Jordan in 1867.

While we have several members of the association with ancestors coming from this area, we have no one descended from Jonathan and Sarah, though Mrs Joan Gradidge has ancestors from Pewsey too. I will send her a copy of your letter and she might get in touch.

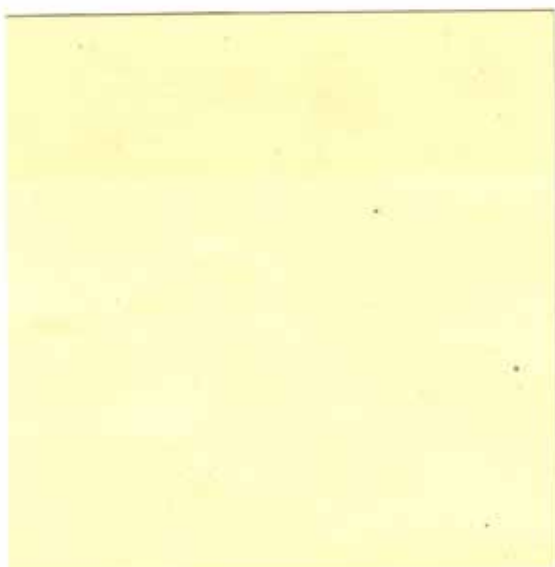
Also unfortunately, I do not know where Jonathan came from before he got married in Pewsey, except that he was resident in Everleigh at the time. I suspect that it was Milton Lilbourne as there is a baptism of a Jonathan, which is quite an unusual name in the area at that time, in that village a little while after his birth. There were so many Goddard families in the Vale of Pewsey that it is hard to distinguish one from another. I was intending to write a booklet on these families but I am very short of anecdotes and photographs and just printing several family trees only giving dates of baptism, marriage and death makes for uninteresting reading.

I wonder who was the father of Elizabeth's son, your father. The son of the Lord of the Manor? Stranger things have happened. I have a friend who is descended in such a way; the family set the girl up with a husband and paid for the baby's upkeep. I too have an embarrassing problem like this. We discovered recently that my grandfather had an illegitimate son. I am now in contact with this son's grand daughter who would like to meet the family. As grand father's secret has been kept for 80 years should I let it be known now?!

I will write a sort piece for the Goddard Newsletter in case someone can help you further.

Great grandmother was Mary Goddard of Milton, Pewsey born 1828, who married George Kimber in 1846. [Mary died 1900 in Milton Lilbourne]

Grandmother was Elizabeth Kimber born 1863 and Mrs Atherton's father was Elizabeth's illegitimate son.

Elizabeth died when he ?name was three years old and he was adopted by the "Speakman" family and did not know that he was a Kimber until his foster mother died.

"Twice a year he was taken to an outfitters and clothed from head to foot."

Mrs Atherton did not know of his illegitimacy until after his death.

"Mary and George had 15 children and Mrs Atherton is decended from the 10th child Elizabeth."

New member **Mrs Edna Atherton** is descended from **Jonathan Goddard** and his wife **Sarah** of Pewsey in Wiltshire through their daughter **Mary** born 1828 and baptised 1830. **Mary** married **George Kimber** in 1846 and their daughter **Elizabeth** is Mrs Atherton's grandmother. Does anyone else recognise this tree as being like their own? I know that there are several members whose families come from near there.
