£100 to **Mary** wife of **James Goddard** of Oxenwood

£100 to **Ruth** wife of **William Cox** of Dursley.

The tenement to go to his brother (no name).

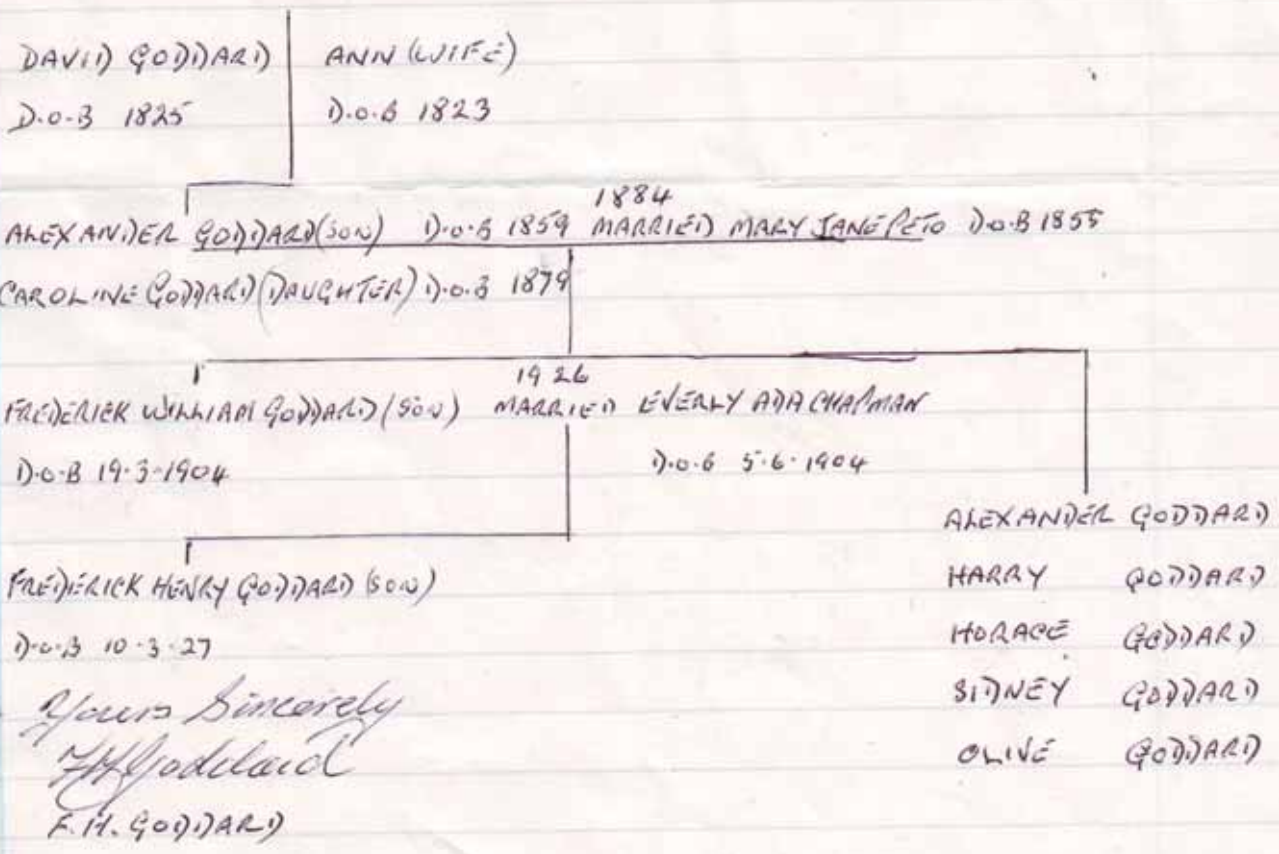
DEAR MRS J. GODDARD

DAVID GODDARD WHO I BELIEVE TO BE MY G.G. FATHER LIVED AT MANNINGFORD BOHUME, WILTS, AND HIS WIFE ANN WAS LIVING AT HILCOTT, WILTS.

AT THE AGE OF 11 YEARS DAVID WAS WORKING ON A FARM. ON THE MARRIAGE CERTIFICATE OF ALEXANDER AND MARY PETO, DAVID'S OCCUPATION IS GIVEN AS 'CARMAN'.

ALEXANDER AND MARY WERE MARRIED IN THE PARISH OF GODALMING, SURREY, THEY THEN WENT TO LIVE <sup>AT</sup> LAMORABEY SIDCUP, KENT. ALEXANDER'S DETAILS ARE CORRECT HE WAS EMPLOYED AS A GARDENER IN 1884.
