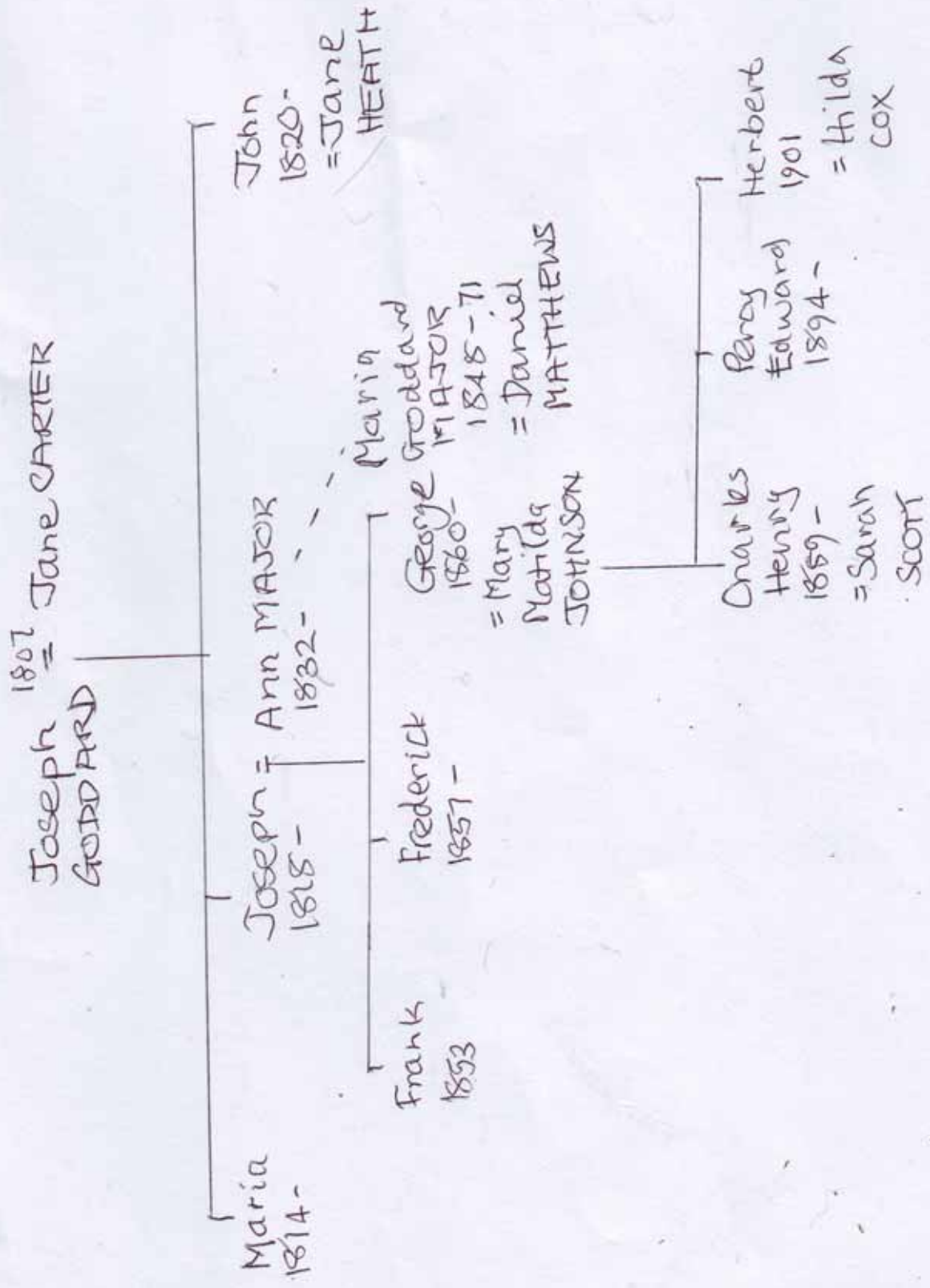

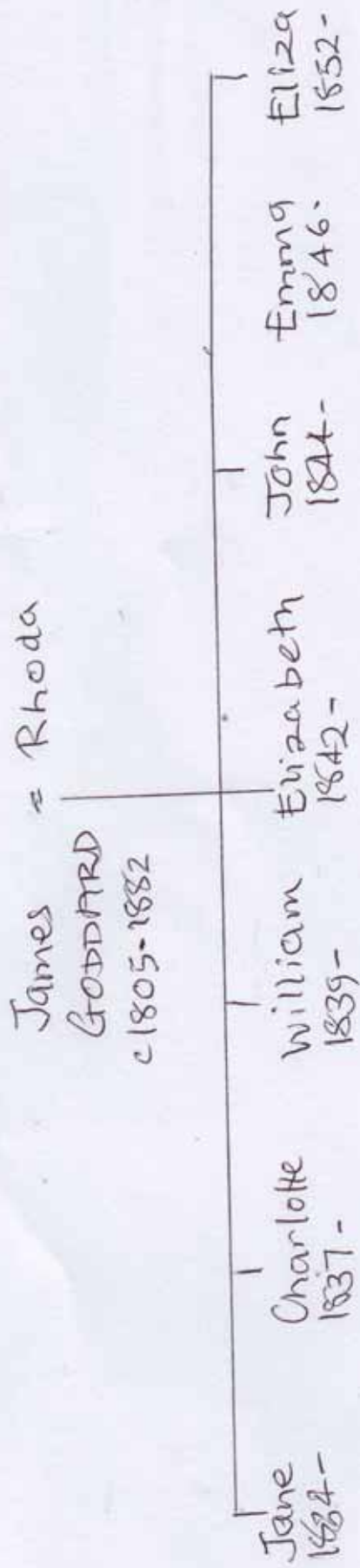

In the 1841 census Orcheston St Mary it shows:-

Joseph (dad) 55

Joseph (son) 20

John (son) 20

Maria (daugh) 25

This would make Joseph senior b.1786 +/-

Joseph senior died 1868 aged 81 (b.1787) Amesbury 5a 115.

But I cannot find the death of his wife Jane. Obviously before the 1841 census.

Do you think I am on the right track?

In the IGI records for Market Lavington it shows Joseph Goddard christened 19 March 1786 - son of Joseph and Anna Maria. They also had the following children:-

Anna Maria b. 1792

Hannah b. 1787

Mary b. 1790

I was searching in the villages around Orcheston and was amazed to find in Market Lavington 42 Goddard christenings there and 12 in West Lavington. For such a small village this seemed extraordinary - in 1801 the population was only 918.

I found James and Rhodas gravestone in Orcheston St Marys churchyard. James died Dec 24 1882 aged 76; Rhoda died Oct 6 1888 aged 79.

IGI individual record (Batch M152301) James Goddard married Rhoda Briant 28 Nov 1833 at Maddington.

Now to West Lavington. The letter from Brian Goddard in Australia lists his forebears thus:

Father Albert Henry born 23 September 1894 at 79 Minny St, St John, Cardiff.

Grandfather John William born 12 January 1875 at 10 Ivor St, St Mary, Glamorgan. Had a brother Edward born 16 August 1876 probably in Cardiff.

G grandfather William born c. 1839 West Lavington. Had seven children one of whom, Charles Thomas, was adopted and taken to the USA as a child. From the other correspondence Wayne C. Grohn is his grandson. He gives more information as follows: born in Cardiff 08 May 1877 or 1878; mother was Ellen ? born at Creech, St Michaels, Somerset. Charles was taken to the USA in 1884 by a relative of the name of Root for reasons unknown.

Dear Julie,

Thanks very much for your recent letter. I was most interested in your information on William Goddard's ancestors.

I and two or three other family members have been researching our family history since the 1960s and we got back to William Goddard (d. 1834) easily enough, but had no idea where he came from. We knew of the land-owning Goddard family at The Lawns in Swindon, as we were a Swindon family, but didn't think it likely there was a connection - 'our' Goddards were farm labourers living around Devizes and Urchfont.

Then, last year, I contacted Mr. Ivor Goddard (we are both members of the Wiltshire FHS) and he suggested William might be the William Goddard born in Wootton Rivers in 1765. I was happy to take this on board, as in the Urchfont parish registers William Goddard is recorded as aged 71 at death - giving a birth date of 1763, which was near enough for me to accept. He kindly sent me a family tree which included the information you've set out, and after checking it out on the internet, I felt this was all perfectly feasible. I enclose a copy of the Wootton Rivers Goddard family tree, as I understand it.

But then came a step which as yet I find I can't accept - that Sarah Goddard (b. 1678) was a daughter of Vincent Goddard (1633 - 1723) and Margaret Illman (d. 1711), and that this Vincent Goddard was the youngest child of Edward Goddard (1584 - 1647/48) and Priscilla D'Oyley (1593 - 1681). I don't know where this information came from and it was this that spurred me to joining the Goddard Association to find out more. Do you know anything about all this?

I was very interested to learn that some descendants have done a great deal of research and would be delighted to hear about what they have found.

Regarding the Wedhampton connection : Wedhampton is part of Urchfont parish. It does not have a church of its own, so the inhabitants were recorded in the Urchfont parish registers. I enclose a copy of the Wedhampton Goddard family tree, which was reconstructed from the Urchfont records. Frederick Keel and Mary Ann Barlow were my great-grandparents.

My family knew that my great-great-grandmother Martha Goddard (1838 – 1875) had been born in Wedhampton, and that led us to the Urchfont registers. I don't know how my uncle found the Marden (also in Wiltshire) connection – William Goddard had married Martha Bull in Marden on 8 July 1790. I have a photograph of the marriage entry in the Marden register. But I know he trawled through a great number of Wiltshire parish registers back in the 1960s and 1970s, before the days of internet and family history society transcriptions which are so helpful now.

I'd also be very interested to hear more about the Pewsey Vale Goddards that you are researching. If it's any help, I do have photographs believed to be of Thomas Goddard (1799 – 1890) and his wife Maria Mundy (1794 – 1878) and their elder daughter Kezia (b. 1830) – Kezia being my great-great-grandmother Martha's elder sister. I can send you copies if you wish.

Finally – are you perhaps one of the Pewsey Vale Goddards? So many questions! I look forward very much to hearing from you.

Julie - thanks for last 2 messages. I will add Simone Lay to my list of people to contact. And you also say there's lots more Pewsey Goddards - oh dear! Because I've just noticed there may be another contender for 'my' William - his cousin William, born 1766, son of Thomas Goddard and Mary Egleton. This 1766 William appeared in Ivor's family tree and in Ian's notes that you sent me, but its possible significance has only just dawned on me. At present I can't see any reason why my William shouldn't be him just as easily as the son of John Goddard and Mary Martin - there's only the one year between them. I'm now wondering how many more William Goddards born around the 1760s there are out there! I'll put this to my contacts and see what happens. Do you have any further information on this 1766 William? e.g. the names of wife and children, since I know the names of 'my' William's wife and children.
