WILL OF JOHN GODDARD OF NEW SARUM, BARBER, PROVED 1708

Wife Martha Goddard. Has house in July ? St., plus 3 other houses – house in Castle Street – Durdalls tenement with annuity to pay 12/-d per year to Mary Merrifield and the landlord is Mr Eires. And mentions a house of John Merrifield.
Daughters Mary Merritt and Martha Bony ??
Witnesses: John Willis and Andrew Randall

WILL OF SARAH GODDARD OF NEW SARUM, SPINSTER, PROVED 1745

Has uncle Robert Spaggs, of Saum, cardmaker, who gets house and land in Dragon/Draghall St., tenant is Mrs Harris.
Aunt Elizabeth Spaggs and their children Robert – Sarah – and Mary Spaggs.
Aunt Mrs Mary Hopkins of Whitchurch, and her children unnamed.
Then Elizabeth daughter of Roger and Elizabeth White, malster of Sarum. Handing out legacies of £70. The last lot got the Dr Scott sermons of 2 volumes.
Then Ambrose Parsons of Bedwyn Row, Sarum and his children unnamed get 30/-d. each.
Then Anne Bevis, spinster gets 50/-d. and her brother-in-law Stephen Johnson and his children unnamed.
Then widow Bevis and her children unnamed and widow Harris, my tenant, and her children unnamed.

WILL OF JAMES GODDARD OF NEW SARUM PROVED 1781 (written 1771)

Wife Mary Goddard. To look after the business and house in Catherine Street. There is other Freehold property and a workshop in Blue Bear Lane next to the corner of the gaol, with a tenant G.Hawker.
Children are – James – George – Mary – and Thomas Goddard.
James is a grocer and cost father £500 apprenticeship with a Mr Rothwell. James has borrowed a lot of money from father to set up in business and has to make a bond with Ambrose Burch, ironmonger and Henry Dench to pay it back.
George is over 21 and Thomas is under 21 years.
Witnesses: John Antrim and John Hodding.

WILL OF MARY GODDARD OF NEW SARUM, WIDOW, PROVED 1796

CHILDREN: Thomas and his wife Elizabeth – George – James – and Mary now the wife of Thomas Chaldecott.
Trustees: Samuel Henderson, junior, of Bristol, merchant, and Joseph Tanner of Sarum, gent.
Witnesses: John Hodding and William Cooper

WILL OF CHRISTIAN GODDARD OF NEW SARUM, SPINSTER, PROVED 1796

Will of William Befford of New Sarum, fishmonger, written 1773 and proved 1785 – no Goddards.

Administration of Thomas Cooper of New Sarum proved 1807 – no Goddards grocer and has mortgage of £205.

Will of William Antram of New Sarum, clothier, proved 1702. – no Goddards – but is related to Coopers and Harris

Will of James Antram of New Sarum, proved 1696. No Goddards

Thomas Goddard, vintner, of Salisbury, is bondman to marriage bond of Christopher Holsham of W. Wellow and Joyce Aldridge of Wellow 17-5-1700

Deed 2647/3. Year 1879-1896.

Walter Goddard of Milford St., Salisbury, livery stable keeper, borrows on mortgage in 1879 £1,000 from John Straughan, 3 Vane St., Bath, retired major,

In 1893 the mortgage is handed over to Mary Maude Rangel ? of Wardour, spinster and Edward Miller of Chichester, Sussex and George Smith of Salisbury, gent. In 2 sections of £360 and £640 at 4 1/2 %

In 1895 George Smith died and Walter Goddard had paid off the £640 by 1896 He had fire insurance with Guardian Fire Insurance. Solicitors were Cobb and Smith

Thomas Boney of Fisherton Anger, clothier, eldest son and heir of Martha Boney, nee Goddard, and Mary Merrifield of New Sarum, spinster, daughter of the late Mary Merrifield, deceased, nee Goddard, who are co-heirs of John Goddard, formerly of New Sarum, deceased, barber, are ending ? a mortgage of £78..15..0d. and selling to Samuel Prankard Perry, of New Sarum, barber, part of a house of several rooms – 1 shop and 1 kitchen within the shop, ..o.. chamber and 1 cock loft or garret over, in Castle Street. Former tenants were – Michael Rich, tailor – then John Goddard – then Francis Rogers, collar maker, deceased, - then William Strong. Then this deed faded and rotted.

John Goddard is appointed warden to sort out problems in the Barbers Surgeons and Silk Weavers Guild year 1614
Richard Goddard of the Joiners Guild paid 5/-d. and Richard Goddard, senior, paid 4d. towards the Guild expenses in 1615
Richard Goddard of the Joiners Guild was paid 4/4d. in 1618
Richard Goddard paid out 20/-d to Joiners Guild in 1618
Robert Goddard paid out 10/-d to the Joiners Guild in 1616
Thomas Goddard, cutler, renews his lease for 40 years of a house and backside next to the Guildhall in the High Street, plus 2 other houses in the High Street at £14..14.0d. Year 1791.
Then just lists of members in year 1675 Thomas Goddard and in 1676 John Goddard

Deed G23-1-264; Year 1612

Richard Goddard, cooper, sevyer, bellows maker and turner paid 4/-d. to his Guild.

MONUMENTS OF SALISBURY

Only mentions Goddards Arms as "A chevron vair between 3 crescents" - no dates found.

Clockmakers Book

John Troke, clockmaker, has a shop in Silver Street, between 1794-1824 and was a former shopman of Mr Goddard, cutler,

Deed 490-297 Year 1784

Thomas Goddard, of New Sarum, cutler, is selling a 1 year lease to the Earl of Radnor, and has as security 2 houses in Downton, with tenants John Musselwhite and John Tanner. Something to do with rigging votes for an election.

Deed 212b/5253

Will of Anne Knight of New Sarum, written 1745 and proved 1755.

Has property in Isle of Wight - Honiton, Devon - Duuxwell - Languard Lee - Hide Luccombe - Brading St Boniface, I.O.W. - Shanklin - Averstone - New Sarum - PLUS **Ballarisia and Down Farm in Witham Friary, Som.**

Had sister Sarah Knight now deceased, and is still settling her estate. (was there a will ?)

Leaves £1,000 and all her property to cousin Mary Stephens, late of W. Cowes, I.O.W. and now lives with Thomas Powell, esq., of Bedfordshire Row, London.

Servants - Jane Bearham - Richard Cumnor - Richard West - Mary Mudge

Then - Anne wife of Charles Carter, barber, annuity of £20 - Ann Wiltshire £10 annuity. Poor of Sarum - Honiton - and Bishopstone

Witnesses; Thomas Hodding - William Slater - and William Jey

Codicil; Land in I.O.W. to go to Thomas Knight of Newport, chandler, for his life only, and then back to Mary Stephens. Then, to carry out her late sisters wishes, money to Charles Harris, baker, of New Sarum and Francis Wiltshire, late of the city, joiner. Wit. Jane and Samuel Troake & Wm Slater
