John Cooper of New Sarum – no Goddards – son Rev, Edward Cooper of Yetminster gets property in Burbage and elsewhere. Proved 1796

Will of William Befford of New Sarum, fishmonger, written 1773 and proved 1785 – no Goddards.

Administration of Thomas Cooper of New Sarum proved 1807 – no Goddards grocer and has mortgage of £205.

Will of William Antram of New Sarum, clothier, proved 1702. – no Goddards – but is related to Coopers and Harris

Will of James Antram of New Sarum, proved 1696. No Goddards

Thomas Goddard, vintner, of Salisbury, is bondman to marriage bond of Christopher Holsham of W. Wellow and Joyce Aldridge of Wellow 17-5-1700

Deed 2647/3. Year 1879- 1896.

Walter Goddard of Milford St., Salisbury, livery stable keeper, borrows on mortgage in 1879 £1,000 from John Straughan, 3 Vane St., Bath, retired major,

In 1893 the mortgage is handed over to Mary Maude Rangel ? of Wardour, spinster and Edward Miller of Chichester, Sussex and George Smith of Salisbury, gent. In 2 sections of £360 an £640 at 4 1/2 %

In 1895 George Smith died and Walter Goddard had paid off the £640. by 1896 He had fire insurance with Guardian Fire Insurance. Solicitors were Cobb and Smith

It takes a long time to wade through all these registers on microfiche. They have not been transcribed.

SALISBURY COUNCIL NOTES. G23 – 1/15 years 1794 to 1832

29 Sept. 1794 James Goddard is mentioned as a councillor of Salis.

28 April 1795. James Goddard is proposed for Alderman.

10 Sept, James Goddard takes his oath and is made an alderman, and takes the place of Samuel Wyatt, dec.

11 April, 1796; William Snook, cutler, renews his lease of a house in Catherine Street, of £6 per year at 40 years. And pays £18 fine. Council property. (looked for Snook wills – none.) James Goddard at this meeting.

5 October 1796: Samuel Whitechurch was proposed to be mayor for next year – declined and paid £100 fine.

Then Edmund White was proposed and declined and paid £100 fine.

Then Thomas Atkinson was proposed and declined and paid £100 fine.

The R. B. Wray was proposed and declined And paid £100 fine.

Then Robert Bateman was proposed etc.

Then Giles Loder was proposed etc.

Then John T. Sharpe was proposed etc.

5 Nov. Thomas Goddard and William Woolfryes were proposed for mayor and Thomas Goddard was chosen.

2 December 1796 Thomas Goddard, esq, mayor, was presiding over his first meeting and through the following year. Also James Goddard continued as alderman all this time.

No wonder the Townhall was getting a brand new portico and iron railings after all those fines.

Dear Mr Jackson

It was very interesting to hear from you as I am interested in the Goddard family in Salisbury.

As far as the Hill's are concerned, I don't think that yours have met mine. My interest is in Lucy Hill and her father John. They lived in the Grosvenor Square & Belgrave Square areas. John was a sailmaker and Lucy married James Goddard on 25th April 1852 at St. Peter's parish church in Perilico. James Goddard (whom she married ^{on the marriage certificate} as his occupation, a coachman living in Belgrave Mews East and his Father's occupation was a licenced victualler. I know that he then lived in Salisbury and his pub was the Wheatsheaf, ~~at~~ just behind the main square. This gentleman was also called James Goddard and is my great, great, great grandfather.

On the same marriage certificate Lucy's father John was a sailmaker presumably living in Belgrave Square, the quoted address of Lucy. Unfortunately that is all the information I

other than she died on 15th March 1897 at 19 Grosvenor Buildings, and is buried at St. George's Cemetery, Hanwell.

I'm sorry but that is all the information I have, which I don't think will be of much use to you.

However, you may be able to help me.


The James Goddard who was at the Wheatsheaf, died on 30th January 1871 and was buried at St. Edmund's Churchyard after the churchyard was closed. His Wife Hannah died on 28th January 1874 and was also buried there.

I believe that there may be a headstone there although there are now left.

Could you see if you can find the headstone and let me know of its whereabouts and the inscriptions that are on it. This may give me some ^{more} clues as to ~~what~~ how the family lived at the time.

They had 7 children. Alfred was born 12-5-1838
and founded Goddard's Garage the BL Dealers.

He ran a coach service to London and I have copies of his advertisements in the the Wiltshire Directory.

John Goddard : Father of Jones, was buried at Donhead St Mary on 16-9-1791 as was his wife Sarah on 26-2-1816
Their headstone is in the churchyard under the window at the East end of the Nave. When I was there a few years ago the details on the stone were difficult to read.

You say in your letter that you are going to Salisbury Record Office on the 14th. I'd be very pleased if you came up with some more information and I enclose a envelope for you to use if your lucky.

Later in the year I'll certainly write to Mr Morland but if you can glean any information from him in the meantime, I'd appreciate it as I'm going abroad, for five weeks with my family this weekend.
